

SDNA is proud to host a debate between the two Republican Party candidates for governor: U.S. Congresswoman Kristi Noem and S.D. Attorney General Marty Jackley. The primary election date is June 5. The general election date is Nov. 6.

A panel of four South Dakota journalists will ask questions of the candidates. Those journalists are: Brianna Schreurs of the SDSU Collegian, Robert Slocum of the Timber Lake Topic, Seth Tupper of the Rapid City Journal and Stu Whitney of the Argus Leader, Sioux Falls.

Governor Dennis Daugaard

2018 Eagle Award Recipient

When Dennis Daugaard was elected as the 32nd governor of South Dakota in 2010, he ushered in a commitment to make government more transparent and accessible that was unparalleled in recent history of the executive branch. Among his first decisions was to make public the invitation lists to governor's events such as the annual pheasant hunt. Gov. Daugaard and Attorney General Jackley in 2012 appointed an open government task force that recommended eight legislative proposals, five of which ultimately became law. The governor has used the power of his office to implement several initiatives to increase accessibility and transparency. He has made available online the minutes and agendas of state boards and commissions. He made state government administrative rules easier to navigate on the state government's website. And Gov. Daugaard has consistently supported the publication of public notices in local newspapers as a way for the taxpayers to know about the business of local governments. During his two terms in office, Gov. Daugaard made a commitment to open government that will serve our state well into the future.

Helen Clausen joined the Eagle Butte News in 1964 as a copy editor. She became managing editor in 1969 and continued in that position until her retirement in 1992. Helen became an award-winning community newspaper journalist who devoted her time and talents to serving the Eagle Butte community and the readers of the Eagle Butte News. She would go across prairie country to take photos of a buffalo herd, travel great distances to a basketball game so there would be photos and a story for the newspaper and would rely on her family to serve as a tasting jury for her cooking column. Helen was widely respected for her work as a community newspaper editor and was well known for her "Round Town with Helen" column. She died in 1998 from complications related to a heart illness.



Brian Hunhoff

Brian Hunhoff started his newspaper career in 1978 at age 18, working for his brother Bernie's Yankton County Observer. By 19, Brian was sports editor, ad manager, circulation director, columnist, photographer, junior partner and co-publisher. Hunhoff worked 1985-1987 for the Yankton Press and Dakotan, but returned to the Observer as editor in 1988 and became sole owner in 1990. Hunhoff was president of SDNA in 1997-98. He is a member of the SDNA First Amendment Committee. Hunhoff currently serves as Yankton County Register of Deeds. He sold the Observer in 2002, but remains a weekly contributing editor. Brian has won countless state and national journalism awards over the years. He received the SDNA Eagle Award in 2005. Brian and his wife Roxann have four children and two grandsons.
